



From the Online Sales Director...

Welcome to 2018!

Online had a spectacular 2017, due to the efforts of the entire Online team, the support of the section chairs, and active volunteers. Thank you all!

It was wonderful sales year, generating \$82,784.08 in sales revenue, from the sale of 3,382 items.

Online is now marketing using two venues, AbeBooks and eBay. Some eBay items are still being photographed to make them more marketable, but great progress has been made in achieving a goal of 100% having actual photographs.

AbeBooks was the initial sales venue of choice when FOL Online was started in 2002. As of the end of 2017, 20,400-plus books have been sold through AbeBooks.

In 2014, an additional vendor, Half.com, was selected to expand our offering, but that site has since been merged into eBay. By marketing in two venues, Online has been able to expand not only the number of items sold monthly, but also the amount of monthly revenues.

In 2017, items were shipped to all U.S. states and territories, and 28 foreign countries. In the Online inventory, there are books in 18 foreign languages, plus a few others that are currently unidentified.

Congratulations to all those persons, past and present, who have worked in the support of Online, and to those who had the initial vision of a new way to generate revenue for our mission of supporting the Lubbock Library. For 2016 and 2017, Online has generated \$151,831 of additional revenues for the Library!

Thank you for your support and encouragement, and we look forward to seeing you at the Half Price Book Sale on the first Friday and Saturday of February 2018.


From the Treasurer...




