



We are now operating in the new 2019 budget. This year we have already paid for the annual Lease Book Plan for our library system, and 75% of the cost of a new CD repair and cleaning machine. We have also bought over \$10,000 worth of e-books and audio books so far this year. Our total 2019 budget for the library is \$191,514. This includes two grants we have received totaling over \$48,000. We take advantage of every opportunity to raise the level of our library's service to the public.

These projects are why we work so hard at the FOL. Each of these projects helps further the mission of the library system of Lubbock, and the general literacy of our children and community.


Now it's time for our 2019 Spring Sale. We have cleared the shelves and filled them with new items. Come find the perfect books for your summer reading list.
