

#### **Books for Ghana, Africa**

During one of the FOL book sales in 2018, a gentleman from Ghana inquired if we might, on occasion, receive donations that we were unable to use. His organization accumulates clothing, shoes, and books for shipment to Ghana and distribution to those in need. While the poverty rate in Ghana is 25%, Africa as a whole has a poverty rate of about 43%. The democratically-elected government is stable and is focusing on clean water, universal health care, and public education for all citizens, but there are still many financial challenges.

FOL checked to see what we might possibly have in unwanted books and noticed that we did receive a large number of books pertaining to the Nursing and Medical field, dictionaries, and educational materials that far exceeded our needs. While the information the books contained was still relevant, the books were out of date. Aspiring nurses-to-be in Ghana would love to have the nursing books to boost their skill set when applying for Nursing School! Over a period of six months, we put together a shipment of about 1,500 boxes of previously unwanted books for Ghana.

A local West Texas trucker volunteered to move the boxes from Lubbock to the non-profit's Wichita Falls facility at no charge, and a group of FOL volunteers spent a Saturday morning loading the 1,500 boxes into a 53-foot van. The FOL books, along with used clothing and shoes at the Wichita Falls facility, were loaded a few weeks later into a 40-foot container and drayed to the container ramp in Dallas. From Dallas, a rail journey ensued to port, and finally the container was loaded on a container ship for the port city of Tema, Ghana. The entire journey was about 35 days. The total cost to ship the container was around \$4,200 and was underwritten by a Canadian doctor.

The Ghana non-profit was elated with the quality of books received, and FOL is now working on a second shipment for sometime in the late spring or early summer of 2020. We feel blessed that we have been able to find a new home for books that we are unable to use in our sales, and will continue to look for new outlets.

#### Wonderful Things Happen at Libraries


