In making donations to the sheds, boxed and bagged books are appreciated. The books arrive in better shape and hold their value for resale.




## From the President...





Volunteers in the Online area are staying very busy. We finished 2019 with strong sales, shipping worldwide. In December, we sold our highest dollar item ever — a book for \$1,300 — all thanks to a volunteer's keen eye while sorting donations. We have more than 11,000 items listed between both our AbeBooks and eBay stores. Current inventory includes a large variety of donated books (fiction, nonfiction, textbooks, home school material, and foreign language), magazines, and board games. We are also looking at additional avenues for online revenue for 2020. We are now collecting used inkjet printer cartridges for recycling and curating designer book sets for decorating/staging. Keep checking our stores on both eBay and AbeBooks. You never know what you might find!






## From the Treasurer...
