  - c) Student/Educator





The FOL response to changing times is to Think Outside the Box!

As local and state restrictions change according the fluctuations of the pandemic, FOL will alter its restrictions on volunteering and shopping as appropriate.

In the meantime, FOL is taking ideas and turning them into actions as we continue to serve the Lubbock Library System and its community.

Some of the innovations we are participating in are:

- · collecting and donating books regularly to the Montford Unit;
- donating select books to the East Lubbock Art House;
- donating select books to the Garrison Geriatric and Care Center through a Tech medical student's project;
- donating select books to the Little Free Library Program of LISD;
- periodically donating excess children's books to local schools in underserved areas; and
- encouraging active volunteers to continue sharing unwanted books with local non-profits.

Some ways we are reaching out to buyers:

- keeping a list of Booksellers to keep them informed of special opportunities;
- keeping a list of educators to keep them informed of special opportunities;
- opening the Mini BookStore pilot program on the main floor of Mahon;
- providing unique shopping opportunities for groups such as the local Down syndrome organization; and
- special sales such as the Spring Educator Sale.

Of course, none of this would be possible without the generous donations of books from the community; the time, effort, and hard work of our volunteers; and the support the local businesses such as United Supermarkets (grocery sacks), Llano Estacado (wine boxes), and the generous donation of storage units by David Postar of Affordable Storage.


#### From the Book Sale VPs... by Loraine Oglesby and Louise Ramsay
