



Some of his books include *John the Cyber Llama*, *John the Cyber Llama*'s *House Party, The Tallest Giraffe*, and *Bunbear Believes in You!*

The author has agreed to do a reading from one of his books during his visit. He will also bring along his paperback books for sale for \$15.00 each. He may even try to work in his music, which he says is a combination of hip hop and rhythm and blues. His performing artist name is A.C. the Bard.

From the Online Sales Director...

Where did 2023 go? Seems like only yesterday that we were saying the same thing about 2022! That said, 2023 was a busy year for the Online section in Lubbock FOL.

A few of the highlights:

- Over 1,500 items sold and shipped
- 1,300+ buyers
- Average sale over \$43
- Highest item sold was a set for \$1,057
- 20 individual sales over \$200
- 27% increase in repeat buyers from 2022 to 2023
- Shipped to over 20 foreign countries as well as all 50 states

We continue to make changes to our way of doing business.

At year-end 2023, we closed out our AbeBooks store and are in the process of merging that inventory into our current eBay inventory. Once the merger is complete, we will have an inventory of approximately 10,000 items. This will add efficiency to the operation by dealing with only one vendor, at a lower overhead cost.

In addition to the normal "online" sales, the Buy Back program we began several years ago continues to produce a growing monthly revenue stream.

Many thanks to the entire volunteer group that keeps us supplied with a never-ending stream of items to research to help us expand our inventory. They are the greatest!





From the Treasurer...

The two charts below show the source of FOL's 2023 income and how our financial contributions to the Lubbock Library System were spent.



Cozy Corner Mystery Book Club is hosted by the Godeke Librarian Carla James. There are 6-8 regular attendees in this cozy mystery book club where

Magical Mondays: The Magic Tree House is a new program started by Branch Manager Amanda Gwin, focusing on young readers transitioning to chapter books. It had a wonderful turn-out at the first program where a Texas Tech Museum paleontologist presented real dinosaur fossils to complement the dinosaur-themed Magic Tree House book.

Crafty Seniors has had an enthusiastic turnout with Dawn Cruz, one of our experienced Library Assistants. The older adults really love the crafts she chooses, and several of them take the craft ideas with them to share.

Godeke Story Time with Rocio. A new Library Assistant this year has brought a fresh face to story time. Bringing her teaching experience and high-interest crafts for our youngest patrons, she has proven to be a welcome asset to the library.

Level Up! (formerly *Teen Link*) has gotten a face lift with a focus on gaming that facilitates social and emotional well-being. This program is hosted by two licensed counselors from Lubbock, as well as the Godeke Librarian, Carla James.

Mahon

The Friends of the Library is truly the backbone of all our library programs across all age groups. FOL funds help us buy art supplies, books, prizes, decorations, snacks, and so much more to keep our community engaged, learning new skills, and coming into the library.

These programs include a bit of everything ranging from art classes to workshops to story times to comedy nights. Our programs with some of the highest attendance this year were Mahon staples for young patrons and their families—the St. Patrick's Day Scavenger Hunt and the Egg Hunt for Little Ones. These programs brought in around 300 and 250 people respectively! We were also able to branch out into newer programs aimed at our teenage and adult patrons like Guess That Anime, Genealogy for Beginners, and Homemade Bath Salts, to name a few.

Overall, every program we are able to offer is a

result of the generosity of FOL. And for that, we are beyond grateful.

Patterson

2023 saw many activities at the Patterson Branch Library.

In February, we hosted the 20th Annual African American History Month Program and Reception honoring the lives and legacies of Bobbie Gean and Thomas James "T.J." Patterson, Sr., through a memorial celebration.

At the end of May, we held our first Summer Reading program Kick-off Ice Cream Social. This event started off the summer reading sign-ups with free ice cream, take-and-make crafts, games, community supporters, and resources. Some community partners that helped with this event were FOL, Alliance Credit Union, Atmos Energy, Maniac Game Shack, and Walk By Faith Radio.

June saw the Juneteenth Kick-Off Celebration, then participation in the Juneteenth Parade. The Kick-Off provided a hub for information concerning activities during Juneteenth week with refreshing lemonade/tea and teacakes, storytime, and questions and answers about why we celebrate Juneteenth.

August is one of our most exciting times of the year. We plan and prepare for National Night Out. This event consists of an evening filled with food, music, and games, all ways to get to know your neighbors and community.

One of our latest events held in September was Ready to Read Storytime. This storytime was fun and unique because we had a guest reader, Jeriami of 806 DC Offroad. He brought monster trucks for the kids to look at and take pictures.

Thanks again to the Friends of the Library for all their generous support in helping the Lubbock Public Libraries continue to provide services and programs to the community.

Summer Reading Program

An astounding impact was achieved in 2023 when the Friends of the Library generously funded our Summer Reading Guides, which proved to be

MMS



We are so grateful to have access to the books that are donated to FOL. They save us so much in terms of time and money when it comes to collection development. The estimated savings from FOL donated items includes, but is not limited to:

- Bestsellers: \$400 (new copies or additional copies added to the collection)
- 2022-2023 Copyright Books: \$697
- Children's Books: \$656 (we added or replaced 41 books from the Warrior Cats series)
- Other Children's Books: \$1,121 (We found some great books to add to our collections!)
