

From the Book Sale VPs...

Do you need any stocking stuffers or presents under the tree this Christmas season for the children in your home? Or for the children at heart? Books are best! Not only is the Lubbock Friends of the Library BookStore the best source for affordable books in Lubbock at \$1 per hardback and 50 cents per paperback, but the children's section is even better — 50 cents per hardback and a quarter per paperback.

The FOL BookStore has every category and genre covered, from board books to picture books to chapter books — fiction and non-fiction. While most fiction books are shelved by the author's last name and nonfiction by category or topic, there are also special sections featuring bestselling authors, award winners, books-to-movies, holidays, and biographies. For those who are children at heart, check out the vintage and classic sections. Consider rebuilding that childhood collection of Nancy Drew, Hardy Boys, Magic Tree House, or Boxcar Children, or picture books by Eric Carle, Margaret Wise Brown, Richard Scarry, or Barbara Cooney.

According to *The Guardian* (2018), the number of books early readers have in their home directly impacts their success in literacy, as well as later academic success. A young reader should have a collection of at least twenty books in their home from which to choose. When children have access to a home library and can choose their own books, their motivation and attitude towards literacy improves. Let the FOL BookStore put your early reader on the road to success!

From the President...

It Takes a Village...

My wife and I have volunteered with the Friends of the Lubbock Library for many years. I tried to number the various volunteer jobs which FOL uses to accomplish its goals.

I started off with donation shed workers, book transportation from the sheds to the main library, sorters, section chairs who stock the shelves, price researchers for our online books, computer input people posting our online offerings, office people, any of the above who help with sweeping the floors and other tasks needed before a sale or assisting buyers during BookStore days, ... and quickly realized that it really does take a village to make and keep the FOL humming along.

We have just had three very successful monthly sales, setting some new records. So it is a big thank you to all of you for your dedication and volunteerism which makes FOL the success it is. With all the opportunities we have, you can find a place to help us support the Lubbock Public Library in their mission to serve the community.

Upcoming Changes at FOL

As you are probably aware, the FOL has grown substantially since its humble beginnings in 1967. We started with a handful of volunteers and a few donated books, having occasional small sales to help fund the library. Since that time, we have grown to over 130 volunteers, approximately 225,000 books shelved at any one time, and BookStores 10 times a year. We also began selling books in online stores in the early 2000s, moving exclusively to eBay in 2014.

When FOL began, we had just a handful of directors focusing on raising money for the library by selling donated books at occasional book sales. The board has undergone several changes and configurations since that time, all resulting in changes to the organization's bylaws. The current Board feels the continued growth and size of current operations calls for the next change in supervision and oversight.

At the annual meeting in April of 2026, we will be putting forth a proposal to change our bylaws to establish a **board**, elected by the membership, and a **management group**, appointed by the elected board. The elected Board would be responsible for ensuring that FOL's mission statement is met, approving budgets, and establishing policies and procedures. The appointed managers would then manage implementation of these guidelines, running FOL on a day-to-day basis, and reporting back to the Board with the results. The current board feels this would be a much more effective way to ensure FOL continues to meet its goals well into the future.

Please be on the lookout for our newsletter in early March for all the details. Also, mark your calendar and plan to attend our Annual Meeting in March. Your vote will be instrumental in changing FOL's oversight and management structure for the future.


